PURPOSE: A major in Criminal Justice is meant to prepare students for career opportunities and advancement in the criminal justice field, which includes law enforcement, courts and corrections, and private security, or, for further study at the graduate level in Criminal Justice, Criminology, or Law.

REQUIREMENTS: To successfully complete the Accelerated Criminal Justice major, Law Enforcement Officers must have 3 years of work experience to be awarded 48 advanced standing credit (15 credits based on ACT 120 certification and 33 credits of work experience) After the 48 credits are granted, the following coursework is required:

- 33 credits as listed under "Major Component/Requirements"
- 12 credits of Major Electives
- 12 credits Skills Component
- 36 CORE credits
- 27 General Elective Credits
- A minimum number of 120 credits are required for degree, the last 30 of which, and 50% of the major must be earned at La Roche College. (Developmental course work does not count toward the minimum number of required credits for graduation.)
