- 30 credits as listed under "Major Component/Requirements"
 - 12 credits of Major Electives
 - 12 credits Skills Component
 - 11 credits Language Component (Spanish or Arabic), waived for students whose native language is not English.
 - 40 CORE credits
 - 15 General Elective Credits
 - A minimum number of 120 credits are required for degree, the last 30 of which, and 50% of the major must be earned at La Roche College. (Developmental course work does not count toward the minimum number of required credits for graduation.)

Certificate Program in Criminalistics: The Criminalistics Certificate Program requires courses in Biology and Chemistry. Refer to the Curriculum Guide for that program, available from your advisor or the Registrar's Office for more information on the certificate.

Internship: CRIM4051, is an elective course. You must have a QPA of at least 2.75 to be eligible for an internship. Before contacting your academic advisor concerning an internship, you must be approved by the Registrar's Office. Your academic advisor will assist you in determining possible internship locations, but you are responsible for contacting the selected organization(s), submitting all required paperwork, arranging pre-employment interviews, and completing the required number of hours within the time allotted.

Accelerated Courses: Criminal Justice courses in the 8-week accelerated format should only be taken by students who have earned over 60 credits and have a QPA of 3.0 or higher.

NOTE TO TRANSFER STUDENTS: Credits earned at technical schools will NOT be accepted for 3000 level Criminal Justice courses. All other transfer decisions will be determined by the Department Chair.
