An Education minor would also be beneficial for those students who may pursue teaching certification at the post-baccalaureate level, including students in academic content areas such as Biology, Chemistry, English, History, or Mathematics who are interested in earning secondary teaching certification after graduating with a bachelor's degree in their subject area.

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS: Minors must be completed within the student's graduation timeline. Students may not major and minor in the same department (e.g., education majors may not declare an education minor).
